The record attendance of church members and friends made this a very high day in the history of the Mamawi Atosketan Native School and in the history of the Alberta Conference Constituency.

Appreciation to each one who attended, helped or contributed. The day closed with a Benefit Banquet and Concert, featuring Forrie Werner and Joe Pearles, and resulted in an offering of \$7,812. "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow!"

## Alberta Pastor Presents Theological Paper

Pastor Alan Delotavo of Fort McMurray was one of the two Canadians who presented a theological paper at the April 2003 Annual Conference of the Society for the Study of Theology held in the University of Newcastle, England. The Society, formerly called the British Society for the Study of Theology, has approximately 400 members; many are world-renowned scholars from Cambridge, Oxford, and other British and some Western European Universities, as well as representatives from the US. Pastor Delotavo has successfully presented a seminar paper entitled "Ethical Considerations on Ecclesio-Political Involvement: A Philippine People Power Case." The paper was commended.
